

# Where to get free notary services?



One of the easiest ways to get free notary service is at a **local bank or credit union** where you have an account. If your bank offers free notary services, you can usually have documents notarized during regular banking hours without a special appointment.

**Information on Notary Services available**, the following offices have notaries available but you must adhere to their requirements due to the pandemic to obtain services:
