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Education Assistance and Higher Education Program Policy Exemptions due to COVID-19 Policy Exemptions #2

Students enrolled in the Education Assistance/Higher Education Program(EAP/HE), attending classes during the Fall 2020 Semester have continued their higher education endeavors in the midst of the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic. The following policy exemptions have been made to address setbacks outside of the student's control due to COVID-19. The policy exemptions will outline how EAP/HE will close out the Fall 2020 semester, including how the changes affect students in their next semester.

- 1. Policy Qualification, Accountability and Timeframe/Duration:
 - a. Qualification: The Education Assistance/Higher Education Program Policy
 - Exemptions #2 apply to students who were is Situation A, B or C:
 - i. <u>Situation A</u>:
 - 1. Funded during the 2020 Fall Semester, and
 - 2. Were directly affected by the pandemic because they either:
 - a. Tested positive for COVID-19 during the 2020 Fall Semester, or
 - b. Have a dependent in their household that tested positive for COVID-19 during the 2020 Fall Semester.
 - ii. <u>Situation B</u>:
 - 1. Funded during the 2020 Fall Semester, and
 - 2. Were enrolled in EAP/HE for the first time during the 2020 Fall Semester.
 - iii. <u>Situation C</u>:
 - 1. A continuing student NOT funded during the 2020 Fall Semester, and
 - 2. Took a leave of absence from the program by proof of a completed 2020 Spring SCW Form from that semester's policy exemptions.
 - iv. **** All students qualify for a Leave of Absence for the 2021 Spring Semester. See policy details below for qualifications. (Section 2.b.i)
 - b. Accountability: The EAP/HE Special Circumstances Waiver Form #2 (SCW#2 Form) is the official document to track and enact the policy exemptions. The student signed form will include a statement recognizing the policy waiver is needed specific to circumstances caused by COVID-19. Completed forms will be filed in two locations: the student file and the EAP/HE 2020 Fall Semester Special Circumstances Policy Exemptions #2 File.
 - c. Timeframe/Duration: Students who apply for the policy exemptions must have a completed and signed SCW#2 Form on file for EAP/HE to process funding for their next semester.
 - i. The SCW#2 Form must be completed, student signed, and submitted to EAP/HE no later than 5 p.m. (MST), February 24, 2021.
 - ii. In the event that the COVID-19 pandemic continues through the Spring 2021 Semester, revised policy exemptions will be used specific for that semester.

- iii. All policy exemption due dates extend one month later for Tohono O'odham Students in Mexico.
- iv. Each semester specific policy exemptions may carry their own timeframe.
- v. Note: the term "Semester" outlines the timeframe EAP/HE pays out a student through the funded year and may not be defined as a "semester" (may include a trimester or quarter).
- 2. Policy Waivers for 2020 Fall Semester:
 - a. Repeated Classes and Funding:
 - i. <u>Situation A and B</u> students are not required to repay or owe credits for classes they have failed.
 - ii. <u>Situation A and B</u> students who are required to repeat classes to meet their program requirements will have those classes funded again by the EAP/HE Program.
 - b. Change in Enrollment Status
 - i. Leave of Absence from the EAP/HE Program:
 - a. <u>Situation A and B</u> or any EAP/HE <u>funded student</u> may request a Leave of Absence from the Program regardless of their 2020 Fall Semester closing status at no penalty to the student.
 - b. <u>Situation C</u> students on leave may request a second Leave of Absence at no penalty to the student.
 - ii. Sustaining Full-Time Status
 - a. <u>Situation A and B</u> students who were registered at full-time status and who earned at least half or more credits than they failed or dropped will be allowed to stay at full-time status for the next funded semester.
