Choose your program of interest

BAE or BAS in Early Childhood Studies **Federal funding**

Requirement: Teach (after graduation) in public K-12 schools with a high percentage of American Indian students for the same number of years that federal funding is provided.

BAE or BAS in Early Childhood Studies **State funding**

Requirement: Teach (after graduation) in public K-12 Arizona schools for the same number of years that Arizona Teachers Academy scholarship funding is provided.

BAE in Special Education and Elementary Education **State funding**

Requirement: Teach (after graduation) in public K-12 Arizona schools for the same number of years that Arizona Teachers Academy scholarship funding is provided.
