COMMUNITY GRANTS

Native American Community Activities and Contributions Grant

The grant supports local tribal community events, activities and programs that promote education and training, health and wellness, cultural preservation, economic development, and / or environmental protection / management.

- **Amount:** Up to \$5,000 per grant
- **Eligibility:** Hualapai Tribe, Pascua Yaqui Tribe, San Carlos Apache Tribe, Tohono O'odham Nation, White Mountain Apache Tribe, Yavapai-Apache Nation, Yavapai Prescott Indian Tribe and nonprofit organizations working with these tribes
- **Application Period:** January 1 to October 31, 2023
- **Awards Announced:** 30 days after receipt of a completed application

Native American Partnership Fund Grant

The grant supports programs and projects that benefit the community as a whole, rather than individuals or small groups, in the areas of education and training, health and wellness, cultural preservation, economic development, and / or environmental protection / management. Applications must demonstrate program and project sustainability beyond the grant period, and supplemental matching funds are highly encouraged. Applications require demonstrated tribal support of the proposal — for example, a certified Tribal Council Resolution, MOU / A with the tribe, Letter of Support signed by the appropriate tribal official(s) or leader(s), or other measure identified by the tribe.

- **Amount:** Typically \$10,000 to \$50,000 per grant
- **Eligibility:** Hualapai Tribe, San Carlos Apache Tribe, Tohono O'odham Nation, White Mountain Apache Tribe, and nonprofit organizations working with these tribes
- **Application Period:** March 6 to July 7, 2023
- **Awards Announced:** August 28, 2023

Navajo Nation Chapter / Community Contributions Grant

The grant supports local tribal community events, activities and programs that promote education and training, health and wellness, cultural preservation, economic development, and / or environmental protection / management.

- **Amount:** Up to \$5,000 per grant
- **Eligibility:** The following Navajo Nation Chapters - Beclabito, Chilchinbeto, Cove, Dennehotso, Kayenta, Mexican Water, Oljato, Red Valley, Shiprock, Smith Lake, Sweet Water and Teec Nos Pos
- **Application Period:** January 1 to October 31, 2023
- **Awards Announced:** 30 days after receipt of a completed application

COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIPS

Freeport-McMoRan supports four competitive scholarship programs. An applicant meeting the eligibility requirements only needs to turn in one application for all four scholarships.

The application period **opens February 1, 2023 and closes June 1, 2023. Apply at bit.ly/NASP23.**

Native American Scholarship	Funded by the Freeport-McMoRan Foundation and administered by Education Forward Arizona at \$3,000 / semester to students enrolled in a four-year program at a university or tribal college and \$1,500 / semester awarded to students enrolled at a two-year program at a community college or tribal college. For students enrolled at trade or technical school, the value of the scholarship will be determined by program length, not to exceed \$15,000. Cyprus Tohono Corporation Scholarship	Four-year scholarship awarded to the top two applicants to cover tuition, fees, books, and room and board at the Arizona resident rate at a four-year public university in Arizona	Enrolled members of the Tohono O'odham Nation
Josiah Moore Memorial Scholarship	One-year scholarship of \$3,000 / semester to a four-year university in Arizona or \$1,500 / semester for a two-year college in Arizona	Enrolled members of the Tohono O'odham Nation
Navajo Code Talkers Scholarship	\$3,000 / semester to students enrolled in a four-year program at a university or tribal college and \$1,500 / semester awarded to students enrolled at a two-year program at a community college or tribal college. For students enrolled at trade or technical school, the value of the scholarship will be determined by program length, not to exceed \$15,000.	Enrolled members of the Navajo Nation

ENTREPRENEURIAL DEVELOPMENT

Project DreamCatcher

This one-week, intensive business training program for Native American women entrepreneurs is fully funded by Freeport-McMoRan and administered by Arizona State University's Thunderbird School of Global Management.

- **Eligibility:** Enrolled female members of the Hualapai Tribe, Navajo Nation, San Carlos Apache Tribe, Tohono O'odham Nation, White Mountain Apache Tribe, Ak-Chin Indian Community, Gila River Indian Community, Hopi Tribe, Pasacua Yaqui Tribe, Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community, Tonto Apache Tribe, Yavapai-Apache Tribe, Yavapai-Prescott Indian Tribe and Zuni Pueblo
