MAKE A PLAN TO VOTE IN THE JULY 15 SPECIAL CONGRESSIONAL PRIMARY

Polling Places Will Be Open 6:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m. on July 15

SELLS, Ariz. – The Tuesday, July 15 Special Primary Election for Congressional District 7 is fast approaching. This special primary will determine which candidates can run in the September 23, 2025 special election to succeed the late U.S. Congressman Raúl Grijalva (D-AZ). There are five Democrats and three Republicans running for their party's nomination in the primary election. The two winners will face off in the general election.

The Tohono O'odham Executive Office and Legislative Council have endorsed former Pima County Supervisor Adelita Grijalva, daughter of the late Congressman, in the Democratic primary. She has been a good friend to the Nation and will continue her father's legacy of fiercely advocating for justice and equality for all.

Polling places will open at 6:00 a.m. on Tuesday, July 15, 2025 and stay open until 7:00 p.m. To vote, you will need to present appropriate identification. This includes one of the following: photo ID such as Arizona Driver's License, Tribal Enrollment card, ID card issued by Arizona Motor Vehicle Division, or other photo ID issued by federal, state, or local government. If you do not have photo ID, you can provide two official documents with your name and address such as a recent utility bill, recent bank or credit union statement, valid Arizona Vehicle Registration, Voter Registration card, and any mail addressed to you that includes the "Official Election Mail" logo.

If you have a mail-in ballot that has not been returned, it is too late to mail it, but it can be dropped off at any polling location on election day. Make a plan to cast your vote and make your voice heard!
