Public Service Announcement
Weather Advisory (July 25-31, 2026)
July 24, 2026

According to the National Weather Service (NWS), an Extreme Heat Warning remains in effect through Saturday for lower elevation areas of southeastern Arizona, including the Sells area and surrounding communities. Temperatures are expected to be 5–10°F above normal before returning to near normal early next week. As the week progresses, monsoon activity is expected to increase, bringing the potential for gusty winds, blowing dust, and isolated flash flooding through the end of next week.

Key Points:

- Extreme Heat Warning – In effect through Saturday for lower elevation areas, including Elevated humidity will make outdoor conditions feel hotter and increase heat-related illness risk.
- Thunderstorm Chances Increase – Storm chances increase this weekend into early next week as the region moves into a more favorable monsoon pattern. Expect daily storm activity through the end of next week.
- Main Storm Impacts – Locally gusty winds exceeding 45 mph, areas of blowing dust, and localized heavy rainfall capable of producing isolated flash flooding.
- Cooling Shelter – Recreation centers will be open during regular hours from 8:00 AM – 8:00 PM this Saturday, July 25, 2026. Stay tuned for additional updates on cooling shelter availability in your community.
